

Perambulation of the Lines between the Towns of Madbury and Lee

According to agreement we the selectmen of the above names towns met on December 28, 1948 near the residence of Harry R. Hill and proceeded to a stone marked M.L.D. 1866 on land now owned by Nehemiah Snell, being the same corner bound between Lee, Madbury and Durham.

The reason for the meeting was to perambulate the lines of Madbury and Lee and renewing the marks and bounds according to law.

We began at the above named stone, thence northerly  $57^{\circ}-35'$  west 220 rods to a stone marked L.M. in the Dube pasture about 300 feet south of the old cemetery, thence same course 161 rods to a rock in the wall on the south side of the road by the land of Nehemiah C. Snell's and opposite the beginning of the old road leading to the so called Emerson Road, the stone being marked M.L. thence same course 186 rods 15 links to a rock marked M.L. and a marked pine tree near the Emerson Road, thence same course 22 rods 5 links to a rock near the stone wall on the northwesterly side of the road leading from Barrington to Madbury (Emerson Road) marker M.L., thence same course 42 rods 18 links to a station in the field of Albert D. Emerson marked L.M.B. 1857, 1885, etc., which is the established corner between the town of Barrington, Madbury and Lee.

In witness thereof we have set our hand this 6th day of January, 1949.
