Jack,

I think your draft is good progress toward the end product but I couldn't help myself... I propose some changes:

• I re-ordered the sub sections to follow what seems to me a more orderly flow from start to finish.

• I reintroduced the terms "limitations and restrictions", here's why: The word "condition" (or "conditional") gets used in two different ways here: conditions for approving the proposed use and conditions for conducting the proposed use. One pertains to the decision to approve the permit in the first place, the other pertains to the use as it occurs after the permit is granted. I think the distinction is worth making (for clarity) and I use the terminology to make it. I use "limitations and restrictions" when referring to the "conditions" under which the use may continue.

If there is a better way to draw the distinction I'm all ears.

- I removed various words I thought we could do without and did related word-smithing.
- I added a few details that occurred to me while reading the whole thing closely.
- I capitalized "Condition Use Permit" throughout, thinking that would help the reader recognize it as a specific thing.
- I did NOT attempt to clean up the outline formatting.

I made all the changes with Track Changes turned on (I think). I inserted a few comments too so if you select "Final: Show Markup" you'll see all that stuff. It is pretty cluttered so you may prefer to view "Final"
