in town affairs:—*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday the 13th of March A.D. 1951 at 11 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following articles.

- ART. 1. To choose the following town officers:
A Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
A Selectman for the ensuing three years.
A Treasurer for the ensuing year.
A Collector of taxes for the ensuing year.
Two Auditors for the ensuing year.
A Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years.
- ART. 2. To choose all other necessary town officers.
- ART. 3. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- ART. 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate for economic advancement of the town through publicity and promotional services of the Seacoast Regional Development Association, in cooperation with other communities, a sum not to exceed one hundredth of one per cent of assessed valuation, \$52.00.
- ART. 5. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$389.67 for class V highways to match the sum of \$1,138.59 to be contributed by the State.

- ART. 6. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed Zoning Law and Building Code.
- ART. 7. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 for the control of the White Pine Blister Rust, in cooperation with the State Forestry and Recreation Department.
- ART. 8 To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.
- ART. 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 14, 1950

ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk: Edna P. Twombly received 42 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Selectman: Joseph Cole received 47 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

For Treasurer: Dorothy W. Rogers received 36 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Collector of Taxes: Fred E. Gerrish received 34 votes and was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Auditors: Richard Hale received 30 votes, Edward Moore, 25 votes, and Albert Evans, 1 vote. Richard Hale and Edward Moore, having a plurality of votes, were declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Trustee of Trust Funds: The Clerk was instructed to cast one ballot for Roscoe Simpson who was declared elected for the ensuing three years. The Moderator was instructed to cast one ballot for Irving Hayes who was declared elected for the ensuing two years.

ARTICLE 2. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to appoint all other necessary town officers.

ARTICLE 3. Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow as high as \$7500 up to the next annual meeting.

ARTICLE 4. An appropriation for the Seacoast Regional Development Association was voted down by a count of 33 to 16.

ARTICLE 5. Voted to raise \$284.60 for Class V Highways to match the sum of \$1,138.38 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 6. Voted not to allow the Selectmen to license Beano games in the town, by a count of 35 to 19.

ARTICLE 7. The estimated budget of \$11,556.81 was approved, with the \$50 estimated for the Seacoast Regional Development Association to be used for the care and improvement of the three town parks.

ARTICLE 8. The annual report of the Planning Board was read and approved.

Voted that the Selectmen and the Planning Board be authorized to contact and meet with representatives of adjacent towns to explore the possibilities of cooperative action on the question of Selectmen-Manager form of Government, as outlined in the Planning Board report.

Voted that the Planning Board be authorized to investigate the possibilities of a zoning ordinance, as outlined in the Planning Board report.

Voted that all appointive officers, except those already appointed for a definite period, shall cease on April 1 and that new appointments be made by the Selectmen for a definite period.

Voted to authorize the Selectmen to sell the North School property at public auction, giving the privilege to the selectmen to reject any or all bids.

Voted that the Selectmen dispose of the contents of the North School building according to their best judgment.

Article 3. To choose a member of the School Board for the ensuing three years.

Article 4. To choose a Treasurer for the ensuing year.

Article 5. To determine and appoint the salaries of the School Board and Truant Officer and fix the compensation of any other officers or agent of the district.

Article 6. To hear the reports of Agents, Auditors, Committees, or Officers chosen, and pass any vote relating thereto.

Article 7. To choose Agents, Auditors, and Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.

Article 8. To see what sums of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums as are estimated to be received from the state equalization fund together with other income; the school board to certify to the selectmen the balance between the estimated revenue and the appropriation which is to be raised by taxes by the town.

Article 9. To see if the District will authorize the School Board to make application for and to receive, in the name

of the District, such advances, grants-in-aid or other funds for educational purposes as may now or hereafter be forthcoming from the Federal Works Agency, or other U. S. Government or State Agencies.

Article 10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.
