**WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING  
TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.**

March 10, 1964

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To the Inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of  
Strafford, and the State of New Hampshire qualified  
to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in  
said Madbury on Tuesday, the 10th day of March, A. D.,  
1964, at 10:00 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the  
following articles.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:

- A town clerk for the ensuing year.
- A selectman for ensuing three years.
- A treasurer for the ensuing year.
- A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.
- Two auditors for the ensuing year.
- A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 3. To see if the Town will vote to authorize  
the selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the Town will vote to raise  
\$317.54 for Class V highways to match the sum of  
\$2,116.91 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the Town will vote to approp-  
riate a sum not exceeding \$2,434.45 for the purpose of  
making improvements to the following Class V roads

within the Town: Drew and Freshet such sums to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 83, Laws of 1951 as amended by Chapter 31, Laws of 1955, and to authorize the Selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$120.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Association.

ARTICLE 7. To see what action the Town will take in regard to a petition to the Town of Madbury to provide for a sum of money adequate to provide for black topping both ends of Evans Road: the East end from Pudding Hill Road to just beyond the driveway of the Evans farm; the West end from Perkins Road to just beyond the driveway of the residence of Jere Chase. (Petitioned by Edward Putney and 14 other legal voters.)

ARTICLE 8. To see what action the Town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.

ARTICLE 9. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

ARTICLE 10. To choose Delegates to the Constitutional Conventional.

ARTICLE 11. To vote on the question "shall sweepstake tickets be sold in this Town?"

Polls will not close before Six o'clock P. M. for voting on Articles 10 and 11.

## RECORD OF TOWN MEETING

March 12, 1963

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### ARTICLE 1. Balloting for town officers:

For Town Clerk for the ensuing year, voted that the Moderator should cast one vote for Lucile D. Hutchins. This being done, Lucile D. Hutchins was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Selectman for the ensuing three years, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Paul M. Raynes and this being done, Paul M. Raynes was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

For Treasurer for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for John W. Printy, and this being done, John W. Printy was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Collector of Taxes for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk should cast one ballot for Dorothy S. Dugan and this being done, Dorothy S. Dugan was declared elected for the ensuing year.

For Auditors for the ensuing year, voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for Lillian R. Duncan and Enid V. James and this being done the two named were declared elected for the ensuing year.

For the Trustee of Trust Funds for the ensuing three years, voted that the Clerk cast one ballot for Harold S. Jones and this being done, Harold S. Jones was declared elected for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. Voted that the Selectmen choose and appoint all other necessary town officers.

ARTICLE 3. Voted to authorize the Selectmen to borrow a sum or sums not exceeding in the aggregate of

\$20,000.00 in anticipation of taxes for the ensuing year and to issue in the name of and on the credit of the town, negotiable notes therefor, said notes to be paid in the current municipal year from taxes collected during the current municipal year.

ARTICLE 4. Approved article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$319.12 for Class V highways to match the sum of \$2,127.44 to be contributed by the state.

ARTICLE 5. Approved article to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to purchase a push frame and blade to be used for snow removal.

ARTICLE 6. This article to see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$100.00 for the Seacoast Regional Development Asso. was passed without action.

ARTICLE 7. The meeting was recessed during discussion of the proposed Zoning ordinance, led by Jesse James, chairman of the Planning Board. Voted that the town adopt the zoning ordinances as recommended by the planning board and amended at the two public hearings. This action was protested by Frank Fenerty.

ARTICLE 8. The meeting was recessed during the final hearings of the recommended Building Regulations. Voted that the town adopt the Building Regulations as amended.

ARTICLE 9. Voted to authorize the selectmen to appoint an Inspector of Buildings to hold office for a term of one year without compensation.

ARTICLE 10. The proposed budget for the current year was amended to include an appropriation of \$300.00 for the toilet facilities at the Town hall to be installed at the discretion of the Selectmen. Approved a total budget of \$22,975.23.

ARTICLE 11. The meeting recessed for the hearing before voting to empower the Planning Board to approve or disapprove, in its discretion, plots showing new streets or the widening thereof, or parks.

ARTICLE 12. Selectman Paul M. Raynes reported a temporary solution of the dump problem with partial agreement by the City of Dover to allow use of their facilities on the Tolend Road, to a limit of 40 families to be admitted by identification cards, the fee to be paid to the town of Madbury at the rate of \$1.00 per month per family and the town to remit payments to the City of Dover. Voted to accept the offer of the City of Dover to use their dumping facilities according to the terms of their proposal.

Fire Chief James Colprit gave a report of the activities of the Madbury Volunteer Department and a plea for additional members.

ARTICLE 13. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

Colonel Edward W. Putney, a charter member of the Madbury Fire Department, was presented an honorary life membership certificate and badge.

Then appeared the above named officers elected under Article 1, and took oath of office as required by law, before me, Edna P. Twombly, Town Clerk.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT REPORT

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To the Citizens of Madbury:

The Madbury Fire Department had it's busiest year in 1963. The usual number of calls was increased by the gravel operation, with flares igniting railroad crossties and grass along the right of way.

Two fires were caused by careless debris burning. The railroad bridge on Madbury Road was set on fire by persons unknown. A woods fire on Nute Road was of incendiary origin, evidence was a charred book of matches, at origin of fire.

Investigation of smoke reported by Stratham Hill Forest Fire Tower revealed a resident burning in an illegal incinerator during the Forest Fire Ban.

The Department helped locate a lost hunter on Nute Road.

The annual purchase of 200 feet of hose improved the hose inventory to a safe level. However, it should be continued for several years.

The purchase of a Base Station Radio Unit (\$150.00 Dept. funds and \$50.00 Town Funds) greatly improves our communications between our Headquarters and Mobile Units, as well as with two Forest Fire Towers, and four surrounding cities and towns.

It is hoped to further improve our communications with tone actuated receivers in a number of firemen's homes.

A course in Equipment Operation was conducted by Instructor Alfred Grimes, with 11 men attending 10 meetings.

The greatest need of our Department still is interested citizens who are willing to give time and effort to enable us to give prompt and effective fire service.

In the interest of fire prevention we ask your continued cooperation in obtaining permits for open fires and incinerators.
