WARRANT FOR TOWN MEETING

TOWN OF MADBURY, N. H.

March 6, 1973

To the inhabitants of the Town of Madbury, County of Strafford, and the State of New Hampshire, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday the 6th of March, A.D. 1973 at 7:30 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles.

The polls will be open from 1:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. for voting by ballot on Article 1 and Article 2.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:

A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

ARTICLE 2. To vote on amendment to the Building Regulations as listed on the official ballot.

ARTICLE 3. To choose all other town officers.

ARTICLE 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow up to the sum of \$40,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.

ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to raise \$350.24 for Class IV and V highways to match the sum of \$2,335.59 to be contributed by the State.

ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$375.00 for the Oyster River Home Health Association.

ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund, established under provisions of the State and Local Fiscal Assistance Act of 1972, the amount of \$12,000.00 to be added to the 1973-1974 TRA, this latter amount, not to exceed \$2,700.00, to be raised through the issuance of notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to

determine the rate of interest thereon, for the rebuilding of Piscataqua Road.

ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize the transfer of the Capital Reserve Fund for the improvement of Class V roads to the Selectmen, to see if the town will vote to accelerate the TRA program for 3 years, and will vote to appropriate a sum not to exceed \$8,100.00 for the purpose of rebuilding Piscataqua Road, such sum to be raised through the issuance of bonds or notes under and in compliance with the provisions of Chapter 241, New Hampshire Revised Statutes Annotated, as amended, and to authorize the selectmen to determine the date and place of payment of such bonds or notes and to determine the rate of interest thereon, and to take such other steps as may be necessary to negotiate such bonds or notes as shall be to the best interests of the Town of Madbury.

ARTICLE 9. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$425.00 as its share for the Strafford Regional Planning Commission.

ARTICLE 10. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$340.00 for the Strafford Guidance Center Inc.

ARTICLE 11. To see if the town will vote to increase the annual salary of the Chairman of the Board of Selectmen to \$500.00, and to increase the salaries of the other selectmen to \$300.00. (Article by Petition)

ARTICLE 12. To see if the town will vote to increase the annual salary of the Town Clerk to \$100.00, and the annual salary of the Town Treasurer to \$200.00.

ARTICLE 13. To see what action the town will take on the proposed budget for the current year.

ARTICLE 14. To see if the town will vote to establish a Conservation Commission under the provisions of R.S.A. 36A, and that the selectmen shall appoint said Commission, to consist of five members, within 30 days of the said annual meeting, and that said selectmen shall also designate, for the purpose of calling the first commission meeting, a temporary chairman.

ARTICLE 15. To transact any other business that may legally come before the meeting.

ARTICLE 5. Voted to raise the sum of \$353.93 for Class IV and V highways to match the sum of \$2,359.96 to be contributed by the state.

ARTICLE 6. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$362.00 for the Oyster River Home Health Association.

ARTICLE 7. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,000.00 to be added to the Capital Reserve Fund for the improvement of Class V highways.

ARTICLE 8. Voted in the affirmative to transfer the fire apparatus capital reserve fund to the selectmen, to raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 to authorize the selectmen to borrow, through the issuance of bonds or notes, a sum not to exceed \$2,000.00 to purchase fire apparatus to equip a fire-truck.

ARTICLE 9. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$350.00 as our share to the Strafford Regional Planning Commission. By ballot — 75 votes cast; Choice-38 — Yes 41 — No 34

ARTICLE 10. Voted to raise and appropriate the sum of \$250.00 to help defray the expenses of the Beech Hill Area.

ARTICLE 11. Proposed budget for the fiscal year 1972-73 — \$25,905.99.

ARTICLE 12. This article was tabled, due to lack of information.

ARTICLE 13. Short discussion of selectmen attending the school meetings, meetings closed at 9:55 so Primary and Town ballots could be counted. Invocation was given by T. Willard Hunter followed by a minute of silence. Meeting adjourned at 3:30 A.M.

MADBURY FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

The 25th year of the Madbury Volunteer Fire Department passed quietly without note with the usual tasks of maintenance and fire fighting, unselfishly performed by devoted men.

The highlights of the year were the acquisition of another truck to improve our fire defenses and the completion of the station addition to house the new equipment.

In March a surplus army vehicle was obtained through civil defense and outfitted as a fire truck by Edward Moody and Son of Nashua.

In April a long series of Tuesday work nights and extra nights began and lasted until December when the station addition was finished.

The 10 x 32 ft. addition across the back of the station provides ample room to house the new truck and our International truck in active service.

The Chevrolet 4 x 4 is at present stored across the back of the station.

It is hoped that it may be possible to house all three vehicles ready for active service in our enlarged station.

The addition to the station was accomplished within our annual budget and from the department treasury. There were also several gifts of supplies and money from townspeople.

The new truck body was completed and equipped within the

fire equipment reserve appropriation and from the department treasury.

The future needs of the department are new hose to replace outdated hose and to build up adequate hose loads for both trucks.

There is also a need for many small items of equipment to completely equip our trucks.

Fire losses for 1972 were the Murphy house and two mobile homes with severe damage to the Liro house.
