You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Madbury on Tuesday the 5th of March, A.D. 1974 at 7:30 o'clock in the evening to act upon the following articles.

The polls will be open from 1:00 P.M. to 9:00 P.M. for voting by ballot on Article 1 and Article 2.

ARTICLE 1. To choose the following Town Officers:

A town clerk for the ensuing year.

A selectman for the ensuing three years.

A treasurer for the ensuing year.

A collector of taxes for the ensuing year.

Two auditors for the ensuing year.

A trustee of trust funds for the ensuing three years.

- ARTICLE 2. To vote on amendment to the Building Regulations as listed on the official ballot.
- ARTICLE 3. To choose all other town officers.
- ARTICLE 4. To see if the town will vote to authorize the selectmen to borrow up to the sum of \$40,000.00 in anticipation of taxes.
- ARTICLE 5. To see if the town will vote to raise \$349.69 for Class IV and V highways to match the sum of \$2,331.27 to be contributed by the State.
- ARTICLE 6. To see if the town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$400.00 as our proportionate share for the Oyster River Youth Association. By Petition.
- ARTICLE 7. To see if the town will vote to rebuild the bridge and two hundred feet approaches on Freshet Road at a cost to the town of \$22,000.00, the State to contribute \$66,000.00. To raise and appropriate by authorizing the transfer of \$5,000.00 of the Capital Reserve Fund for Class V roads to the selectmen, the withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under provisions of State and local Fiscal assistance act of 1972 the amount of \$11,000.00. To raise \$2,000.00 this year and issue 2 notes for \$2,000.00 each, payable each of the ensuing years.
- ARTICLE 8. To see if the town will vote to authorize withdrawal from Revenue Sharing Fund, established under provisions of the state and local Fiscal assistance act of 1972, the amount of \$2,500.00 for the purchase of a snow plow.

MADBURY FIRE DEPARTMENT

To the Citizens of Madbury:

The Madbury Volunteer Fire Department had one of its busiest years with a total of 21 calls, which includes actual fires and calls to check reported smokes. There were several calls to assist other departments and to participate in parades.

There were several calls for debris fires without permits. Permits are required for all outdoor fires and the times to burn are limited to the hours before 9:00 A.M. and after 5:00 P.M. by a directive from the State Forester. Permits are required for all fires except when the ground is covered with snow.

Improvements to the department were mostly additions of small equipment such as nozzles and adapters and some 1½" hose. The major improvement to the station was removal of the columns supporting the second floor and installation of an I beam to support the same. This has made it possible to house three trucks in active service.

The department's greatest need is manpower, and I take this opportunity to ask all men of Madbury to give of yourself to the town to help supply this vital service.

STRAFFORD REGIONAL PLANNING COMMISSION

The year 1973 marks the first time the Strafford Regional Planning Commission (SRPC), since its beginning in 1968, has secured space enough to work in and staff enough to do the work. In May, Michael Kulka came from Pennsylvania to be the SRPC executive director. The move was made in the summer to the new offices on the third floor of the Masonic Building, 90 Washington St., Dover. In September, John Metee came from Vermont to join the staff as planner. Jack lives in Madbury at the DeMerritt Apartments. The staff also includes secretarial help and part-time interns and draftsmen.

Work of the Strafford Regional Planning Commission. The activities of the SRPC are strictly advisory, and the work falls broadly into three categories: 1 - reviewing applications for federal funding and evaluating proposals either from state agencies or before them, as the proposals may relate to the Strafford Region; 2 - conducting regional studies and regional planning; 3 - providing information and assistance to the towns and cities in the region on local planning problems.

- 1. Review of applications. Among applications evaluated this year were proposals for housing, open space, transportation study, and the Seabrook nuclear power plant. Currently being studied is the oil port and refinery development complex.
- 2. Regional studies and planning. Completed this year were a preliminary regional comprehensive plan and an inventory of regional housing supply and demand conditions. Underway is an environmental analysis of the southern part of the region (including Madbury). Under planner Jack Metee, basic information is being collected, interpreted, and plotted on large maps (2000'-1") about bedrock and soils conditions, ground water, and watershed, elevation and slope, vegetation and other conditions of the environment— information needed to make sound decisions on the use of land and the management of the natural resources of the region.

Another ongoing study of solid waste management seeks to find the most economically and environmentally sound ways for communities of the Strafford Region to handle their solid waste problems. An analysis of salvage markets and industrial recyclers present or potential within the region or nearby will be made to see if these operations can be practically used to reduce the community solid waste management problems.

3. Local assistance - to Madbury has been supplied by SRPC at the request of the Madbury Water Board on two important

projects:

Barbadoes Pond. The SRPC is financially supporting a detailed study of the Barbadoes Pond environment by a UNH interdepartmental team. Using seismic and other techniques to map the bedrock and soils conditions under the pond, the team seeks to determine the water relationships affecting the pond and its water level changes. The study will analyse the physical and chemical properties and the biological production of the pond and will interpret the effects upon the pond of different water and land uses which may develop or be proposed for the pond area.

Base Map of Madbury. The SRPC has prepared a large map (1000' - 1") of Madbury and surroundings significant to planning and development in Madbury. Boundaries extend to the Cocheco, Bellamy and Oyster Rivers, Routes #4 and #125 and the Spaulding Turnpike, and to the urban centers of Dover and Durham. Inexpensive prints can be made of this map for many town purposes. Planner Mettee has met with members of the Conservation Commission, the Planning Board and the Water Board to describe some mapping methods. He will assist the Water Board and the Conservation Commission to map the water resources and other natural resources of Madbury.

Local assistance to other communities. Some examples of technical assistance given by SRPC at the request of member communities:

Dover: help with a grant application, an inventory of historic and architectural value of buildings in a downtown area.

Durham: a layout plan for recreational activities.

Nottingham: suggested revisions of building code and subdivision ordinance.

Rollinsford: suggested use of structures and a historic district development plan for Salmon Falls Village.

Newmarket: helping the town develop a master planfinding its goals and preparing maps to analyse land suitability.

The SRPC commissioners from Madbury would like to emphasize that the SRPC can provide many services to Madbury for the asking. But there must be a request, and it should come from an official board or commission in the town.

Financing comes from federal, state, and local sources. Less than half of the income is from the member communities. The SRPC schedule of shares for existing members remains the same this year as last. Any increase in local income will come from new members. Madbury's share, \$425, is just over 1% of the local contribution of \$25,850, and it is less than half of 1% of the total anticipated income. Detailed reports of the past years activities and expenditures and the anticipated plan of work and budget are available at the SRPC office.

Membership in the Strafford Regional Planning Commission has increased steadily from the original three in 1968 to a majority of the region's fifteen municipalities in 1973. Strafford County is also a member of SRPC, and its membership assures the commission of the population percentage needed to qualify for certain funding programs.

Strafford Region with a population of 76,964 and an area of 450 square miles (Strafford County plus Nottingham and Newmarket) is one of seventeen planning regions delineated for New Hampshire by Executive Order. A subsequent executive order, #15, establishes a system combining these regions into six districts for administrative purposes. The Strafford, Southeastern N. H. and Southern Rockingham Planning Commissions have been meeting to coordinate efforts to comply with Executive Order #15. An article in the Warrant asks that the town authorize the SRPC members to join in a regional council, which would serve as a channel to the state and federal agencies and satisfy the requirement of Executive Order #15.

MADBURY WATER DISTRICT

The tone for the year ahead was set at the 1973 Annual Meeting. After the regular business meeting, we were privileged to hear a talk by John Cotton, a hydrologist with the U. S. Geological Survey. He showed us with slides how lakes, streams, and waterbearing gravel deposits were formed by glacial action, and how surface features give clues to the presence of ground water resources.

Barbadoes Pond, which was formed by glacial action, has been the subject of many meetings and field trips. Our purpose is to find out whether the pond is in good health and what kinds of use the pond and its watershed will support without damage. We have had volunteer help from the University and financial support from the Strafford Regional Planning Commission. Many others have shown interest and given their cooperation. The initial investigation should be complete in June, 1974.

At our request, the Strafford Regional Planning Commission has drawn up a large scale map of Madbury and its immediate surroundings. The Board proposes to use prints from this base map to develop maps of water resources, such as surface water, water for fire protection, water service available from neighbor communities, and ground water potential. Prints can also be made for use by the Planning Board, the Conservation Commission, and for other town purposes as needed.

The Board acted on a number of other matters during the year, including:

The effect on an adjacent property owner's well of herbicide spraying and erosion in the power line rightof-way.

The Portsmouth Water Works' request for Federal and State permits to discharge waste water into Johnson's Creek. Regulations for the recreational use of Bellamy Reservoir and its watershed.

Recommendations to the Planning Board and the Zoning Board of Adjustment concerning the protection of ground water.

A full report will be available at the Annual Meeting on March 27, 1974, at which time another interesting and informative program is planned.
